IT IS ALMOST POOL TIME AGAIN!

We will begin heating the Pool May 1, 2018. As a reminder the Pool and Spa rules are listed below.

SPA AND POOL RULES AND REGLATIONS

- Shower before entering the pool or spa. Bring your own towel. Paper towels are for hand/face use only. Do not use paper towels in the shower for any purpose.
- Soap, detergents, body wash, etc. are not permitted in the pool or spa.
- Set spa aerator to operate for more than 5 minutes to ensure automatic turnoff.
- The pool/spa opens at sunrise and closes at 10:00 p.m.
- Individuals under the age of 14 years may not use the pool/spa. No small children in the spa.
- No jumping or horseplay in the pool or spa area.
- No food or glass containers permitted in the pool/spa area.
- The water temperature of the spa will be maintained at 102-104 degrees year round.
- Individuals with an infectious or contagious physical condition, may not use the pool/spa.
- All Guests must be accompanied by a resident at all times.
- Please NO smoking at the patio area, pool or spa

TIME TO CLEAN OUT THE GARAGES AND THE CLOSETS THE DUMPSTER IS COMING

The dumpster will be on the PIV III Property May 22 to May 29th it is for PIV III Residents <u>only</u>.

GUIDELINES: When using the dumpster, please walk in and place your items *entirely* within the dumpster starting in the back and not just in the entry area.

The following items are NOT allowed in the dumpster:

- 1. Building materials such as asphalt, stucco, sand, sod, roof tiles, concrete/ brick, dirt, rocks, and roofing materials.
- 2. Hazardous waste, paints, chemicals, televisions, computer monitors or parts, large appliances, car parts, or liquids of any kind.
- 3. Electronics of any kind are not allowed. Furniture is okay.

HOMELESS SHELTER UPDATE

Several MSII residents attended the special Laguna Niguel City Council meeting on Tuesday, March 19th to learn about the plans for a homeless tent shelter for up to 100 persons, directly below us on county land (that had been donated for free by the city to the county for the former Harbor Justice Center.) Under pressure from the Federal Courts, on March 18th the Orange County Commissioners voted to designate Irvine, Huntington Beach and Laguna Niguel as the sites for the homeless that were removed from the Santa Ana Riverbed encampment.

Hundreds of Laguna Niguel residents attended the meeting and many voiced their opinions adamantly opposing this location in our community because it is located directly across the street from KinderCare and between the Library and City Hall. The City Council was 100% against the proposition but our County Supervisor, Lisa Bartlett, voted in favor of it in the earlier County Commissioners' meeting. It was learned in the meeting that the County had access to over \$100 million for solving this problem but put any constructive decisions off until the last minute, which meant coming up with this rushed, outrageous plan.

While all the elected representatives said the right things Tuesday night and vowed to fight the decision, it is up to the public to remain engaged to ensure that their words are not just words. Tuesday evening Irvine, Huntington Beach and Laguna Niguel voted to sue the County over this issue. We as an Association will continue to follow these developments and push for a more rational solution.

Given the location in the heart of the City Center, inaccessibility of services and inadequate service by public

transportation, the homeless tent dwellers will be isolated and could pose significant risks to the health and safety of our community.
